- **4**th GWC management are currently in the midst of the financial budget process for 2021. Pray for wisdom as they look ahead to next year and for the successful completion of the budget exercise.
- 5th GWC alumni Gareth Heuer and Luan Stoop are hosting "Collide Conference", an online conference with the theme "In His Image" on 10th October. Please pray for them and speaker, GWC alumnus Rev. Musawenkosi Ntinga. Pray, also, that those attending will grow in their knowledge of the Lord.
- **6**th As the fundraising team seek to meet the 2020 donations targets in the last quarter, please pray there will be no funding deficit.
